

Recap on works to date

It's lights, cladding, action as the new multipurpose sport and recreation facility at Percy Treyvaud Memorial Park continues to take shape.

Since our last update, we've installed the wall cladding for the new stadium and the timber sports flooring arrived. We moved the light towers, fitted with new LED light, now in use for the sporting ovals.

All remaining mechanical equipment is now on site, with installation underway. This includes the energy-efficient electric heat pump system, which replaces the traditional gas boilers used for heating.

We put in more than 14,000 hours of work in March, taking our total to over 89,000 since work began early 2022.

What to expect in the month ahead

Tennis courts

» The concrete slabs on the tennis court will soon be completed.

Pavilion

The sporting club pavilion external walls will be completed this month, with windows to follow. And work on the internal plasterboard and linings continues.

Quentin Road

» We still need access to the eastern end of the site, so please expect similar traffic volumes, although this will lessen during April.

Carpark

» The temporary parking remains closed to public. Please observe local parking restriction

Rob Roy Pathway

» The pedestrian footpath will be closed for several days so we can install new public lighting in May.



WORK SITE

In accordance with WorkSafe and OH&S practices, pedestrian access within the worksite will be restricted during the project.

Environment and sustainability

We have received test certificates confirming the structural steel used onsite is from local steel distributors, with about 90 per cent Australianmade, satisfying Australian Standards.

During demolition, we removed 987 tonnes of building materials, of which we recycled over 907 tonnes. That means 92 per cent of what we removed was recycled into new products and materials.
