CONSTRUCTION UPDATE 13

August 2023

Recap on works to date

Spring is on the way and work at the Percy Treyvaud Memorial Park multi-purpose sport and recreation facility is blooming. Last month, we refreshed the playground area on Quentin Road, adding new park benches and tables, a community barbecue, and paths. Progress inside the new pavilion has continued apace, too. We've laid carpet and tiling, installed the lift, and finished the change rooms and toilets, and we've marked the four internal sport courts, ready to play ball. While nobody is home yet, the lights are on. We connected the facility to power at the end of July. We completed 13,600 hours in July, bringing our total hours worked since January 2022 to 148,600.

What to expect in the month ahead

Rob Roy Road footpath closure

Thank you for your patience while the Rob Roy Road footpath remains closed until Monday, 21 August, so we can finish the lighting and landscaping works. We've put up temporary construction hoarding around the work areas. Construction vehicle access will be via Quentin Road. Traffic management will be in place to allow vehicles to enter and exit the site safely.

Outdoor landscaping

We're putting the finishing touches to the new upper-level outdoor terrace area. Construction is almost done, and this month we'll add soil, plants, and mulch to the sweeping bluestone garden beds, bringing the area to life, and creating a beautiful, relaxing communal space.

Bowling green

The 1,500m² eight lane all weather bowling green is taking final shape. The turf goes in this month. We've also installed upwards-facing lighting under the sprawling canopy to reduce shadows and increase brightness.

The new Percy Treyvaud Memorial Park indoor sports courts are almost complete. They include markings for netball, basketball, volleyball, and badminton. City of Stonnington is inviting Expressions of Interest (EOIs) to use the courts at:
