

## Recap on works to date

Work is bowling along on the Percy Treyvaud Memorial Park's new multipurpose sport and recreation facility. We've finished the outside walls of the sporting club pavilion. And we've begun shingle cladding the stadium, which will take about two months. Other work continues in line with the construction schedule. We put in more than 12,800 hours of work in March. That takes the total hours since work began in early 2022 to 101,000.

## What to expect in the month ahead

#### **Pavilion**

Installation of the external pavilion windows will begin. These will be double glazed with the ability to open for natural ventilation, giving the facility better thermal and acoustic performance.

#### **Indoor sports courts**

We'll begin laying the timber netball and basketball court flooring. We anticipate it will take us 10 weeks from the time the timber is placed in position to being cleaned and ready to play ball.

#### Lawn bowls

We'll start hoisting the bowling green synthetic canopy in early June. This large weather resistant shade structure over the bowling lawn will allow game play come rain, hail or shine.
