

Recap on works to date

We're now one year into the planned two-year build, construction is progressing well and more than 75,000 working hours have been completed on site since work began in early 2022.

Since the last update, the sports stadium roof has been installed and the roof on the club pavilion is nearing completion.

Water tanks with a 90,000+ litre capacity - for irrigation and toilet facilities - have been installed and the builder's site office and facilities have relocated to the Chadstone Road end of the site. We've relocated the site office to free up the area where we will be building the new tennis court at the Quentin Road end of the site.

We will avoid entering the site from Quentin Road but if we need to we will notify residents beforehand.

Traffic management controllers continue to manage pedestrian safety and access to site.

What to expect in the month ahead

Lighting

» New lighting along the Rob Roy Pathway will be installed in the coming months. This will require a minor change to pedestrian access, and we will share more information about that soon.

Tennis courts

you may notice more noise on Quentin Road in March as we begin work on the tennis courts, the associated landscaping, and paving.

Pavilion

» We're currently installing the sporting club pavilion internal walls.

Carpark

» The temporary car park is now closed to public. Please observe local parking restrictions.

Environment and sustainability

During the demolition works, we removed 987 tonnes of building materials, of which we recycled over 907 tonnes. That means 92 per cent of what we removed was recycled into new products and materials

- » Playground access will remain throughout construction, via the Rob Roy Road footpath
- » For everyone's safety, we have fenced the construction area and restricted access.
