Competition summary

'What's Your Story?' is a writing competition presented by Stonnington Libraries.

Works can be fiction or non-fiction and based on any theme however must be original and previously unpublished at the time of entry.

Prizes are awarded for Short Story, Poetry and Creative Writing.

To enter the short story and poetry categories you need to be 18 years or over and living in Victoria, while young people aged 5 to 17 years, who live, go to school or work in Stonnington, are invited to enter one of three creative writing categories.

You can enter more than one category if applicable however there is a maximum of one entry per category. For more information, please refer to the 'Categories and Prizes' section.

Category winners will be notified in writing by Friday 1 November 2024.

Categories and Prizes

Poetry – Adult

For: Victorian residents 18+ years Guidelines: Maximum 40 lines Prize: \$500

Short story – Adult

For: Victorian residents 18+ years Guidelines: Maximum 1000 words Prize: \$500

Creative writing, 5 to 8 years

For: Young people aged 5 to 8 years who live or go to school in Stonnington. Guidelines: Limit of 300 to 500 words. The entry can be fiction or inspired by real events experienced by the author.

Prize: \$100 book voucher

Creative writing, 9 to 12 years

For: Young people aged 9 to 12 years who live or go to school in Stonnington. Guidelines: Limit of 500 to 750 words. The entry can be fiction or inspired by real events experienced by the author.

Prize: \$200 book voucher

Creative writing, 13 to 17 years

For: Young people aged 13 to 17 years who live, work or go to school in Stonnington.

Guidelines: Limit of 750 to 900 words. The entry can be fiction or inspired by real events experienced by the author.

Prize: \$300 book voucher

Entry Form: Terms and Conditions of entry (Adult Categories)

This entry form is for the Short Story and Poetry categories of the 'What's Your Story?' Writing Competition (the Adult categories).

Please read the following entry conditions before submitting your Entry:

- 1. This competition is administered by Stonnington Library and Information Services part of Stonnington City Council (the 'Promoter'), 311 Glenferrie Road, Malvern, VIC 3144.
- 2. Entry to the Short Story and Poetry Adult categories is open to all Victorian residents aged 18 years and over as at 31 July 2024. Entry is open to anyone residing in Victoria, except employees and immediate families of the Promoter, associated companies and agencies and prize givers.
- 3. The person entering the competition must be the author of the Entry.
- 4. There is a limit of one Entry per Entrant per Category.
- 5. There is no entry fee.
- 6. The competition commences AEST on Saturday 1 June 2024 at 12am and closes at 11.59pm on Wednesday 31 July 2024. Late entries will not be accepted.
- 7. The competition is open to emerging writers. An emerging writer is a writer who has not published a single-authored book or full-length chapter book with commercial distribution. If you have self-published, or have works in anthologies, magazines, or journals, you are still eligible.
- 8. Details of the competition categories and prizes are contained online at **stonnington.vic.gov.au/Library/Writing-Competition**

Some competition categories have additional criteria that must be achieved to be eligible in that category. Entrants can only submit one piece of work per entry category in this competition.

- 9. Entries into the Short Story Adult category must meet the following requirements in order for their entry to be valid:
 - a. Aged 18 or older at the time of entry into the competition;
 - b. The Entry must be a maximum of 1000 words;
 - c. Entries must be typed in black ink, Arial 12 font and be double spaced;
 - d. All pages must show the title of the Entry at the head of each page; and

- e. All pages must be numbered.
- 10. Entries into the Poetry Adult category must meet the following requirements for their entry to be valid:
 - a. Aged 18 or older at the time of entry into the competition;
 - b. Poetry entry should be no more than 40 lines in length;
 - c. Poems must be typed in black ink, Arial 12 font and be double spaced;
 - d. All pages must show the title of the poem at the head of each page; and
 - e. All pages must be numbered.
- 11. All valid entries must be submitted online by completing the entry form and be received by the Council during the competition period. If required, assistance to upload attachments to the entry form is available at any Stonnington Library.
- 12. Entries must be original, written in English, and previously unpublished (either in print or online) at the time of entry.
- 13. Entries must comply to the word limit. Entries exceeding the word limit will be deemed invalid.
- 14. Entries that are incomprehensible, illegible, incomplete, or do not comply with these terms and conditions will be deemed invalid.
- 15. Entries that are considered to be of an offensive, harassing, defamatory or discriminatory nature will be rejected and considered invalid.
- 16. To maintain anonymity for judging purposes, the author's name should not appear on any part of the Entry. The author's name and details must be confined to the entry form only.
- 17. Due to an expected large number of entries, the Promoter will acknowledge receipt of entries via automated response.
- 18. The Promoter does not accept responsibility for late, lost, damaged, misdirected or incomplete entries. The Promoter, associated agencies and companies and prize givers associated with this promotion take no responsibility for prizes that are damaged or lost in transit.
- 19. This competition is a game of skill. There is no element of chance.
- 20. The winning Entry will be selected based on its originality, skill and effectiveness as a short story or poem by a panel of judges made up of Stonnington Library staff.

- 21. The winner will receive a prize as outlined on the Categories and Prizes page. In the event of there being joint winners, the prize money will be equally divided. Prize money will be paid via Electronic Funds Transfer. Prizes are non-transferable.

The verifications required are at the sole discretion of the Promoter and if these requirements cannot be satisfied, the winner will forfeit the prize in whole and no substitute will be offered or compensation paid.

Terms and Conditions of entry (Creative Writing - Under 18 years of age categories)

These terms and conditions are for the Creative Writing Under 18s categories of the 'What's Your Story?' Writing competition.

Please read the following entry conditions before submitting your Entry:

- This competition is administered by Stonnington Library and Information Services part of the Stonnington City Council (the 'Promoter'), 311 Glenferrie Road, Malvern, VIC 3144.
- 2. Entry to the Creative Writing Under 18s categories is open to all Stonnington residents and educational institution attendees aged under 18 years of age at 31 July 2024 provided that institution is located within the City of Stonnington. Entry is not open to employees of the Promotor and immediate families of the Promoter, associated companies and agencies and prize givers. Persons under the age of 18 need their parent's/guardian's permission to enter this competition.
- 3. The person entering the competition must be the author of the Entry.
- 4. There is a limit of one Entry per Entrant per Category.
- 5. There is no entry fee.
- 6. The entry will include age appropriate language and will be the authors original work.
- 7. The competition commences AEST on Saturday 1 June 2024 at 12am and closes at 11.59pm on Wednesday 31 July 2024. Late entries will not be accepted.
- 8. The competition is open to emerging writers. An emerging writer is a writer who has not published a single-authored book or full-length chapter book with commercial distribution. If you have self-published, or have works in anthologies, magazines, or journals, you are still eligible.

- e. Entries must be typed in black ink, Arial 12 font and be double spaced;
- f. All pages must show the title of the Entry at the head of each page; and
- g. All pages must be numbered.
- 11. Entries into the Creative writing, 9 to 12 years of age category must meet the following requirements in order for their entry to be valid:
 - a. Aged 9 to 12 years of age at the time of entry into the competition;
 - b. Entrant must reside in or go to school within the bounds of the City of Stonnington;
 - c. Entries can be either fiction or non-fiction and must be 500 words minimum and not exceed 750 words;
 - d. Must be submitted with the form labelled Entry Form: Creative Writing, 9 to 12 years of age;
 - e. Entries must be typed in black ink, Arial 12 font and be double spaced;
 - f. All pages must show the title of the Entry at the head of each page; and
 - g. All pages must be numbered.
- 12. Entries into the Creative writing, 13 to 17 years of age category must meet the following requirements in order for their entry to be valid:
 - a. Aged 13 to 17 years of age at the time of entry into the competition;
 - b. Entrant must reside in, go to school or work within the bounds of the City of Stonnington;
 - c. Entries can be either fiction or non-fiction and must be a minimum of 750 words and not exceed 900 words;

- d. Must be submitted with the form labelled Entry Form: Creative Writing, 13 to 17 years of age;
- e. Entries must be typed in black ink, Arial 12 font and be double spaced;
- f. All pages must show the title of the Entry at the head of each page; and
- g. All pages must be numbered.
- 13. All valid entries must be submitted online by completing the entry form and be received by the Council during the competition period. If required, assistance to upload attachments to the entry form is available at any Stonnington Library.
- 14. Entries must be original, written in English, and previously unpublished (either in print or online) at the time of entry.
